Leprosy brings about disfigurement and deformities and makes the person unclean and according to our first reading this Sunday the unclean person must live alone. "He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp." This disease pushes the infected persons to the margin of society. And our society classified them as outcast. An outcast loses all privileges including living with family and community. In order to protect healthy people, the lepers had to cry out, 'unclean, unclean!' Then, they will have to present themselves to a priest who would declare people clean or unclean. (Lev. 13). Once declared unclean the leper becomes an outcast.

The man in the gospel today has just been declared unclean and he came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said, "if you wish you can make me clean." Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him, "I do will it. Be made clean."

Leprosy and sin mirrors each other in many aspects. A sinner in effect is an outcast, he alienates himself from the community. He is considered marginalized. Just like the leper he is a burden to himself. Sin makes life burdensome for oneself and for others. Every sin affects the society whether it is a hidden sin it hurts and affects the community. That is why there is no such sin as a private sin, every sin is social in nature.

However, even if leprosy is external and sin is internal both has similar consequences on the person. It makes the person unclean. Both the first reading and the gospel affirms and recognizes the significant role of the priest in declaring the person clean and unclean.

What is the implication of this to sin? Jesus does not want to forgive us without his priests and his Church! Jesus will continue to make us clean through

his priests especially in the sacrament of confession. And thus St. Paul urges us in the second reading to be imitators of Christ who continue his ministry of healing and forgiving. May we become like him in our dealings with those of the outcast of our society and give glory to God.

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La lepra produce desfiguración y deformidades y hace que la persona sea impura. Según nuestra primera lectura de este domingo la persona impura debe vivir solo. "Vivirá separado y establecerá su hogar fuera de la ciudad.". Esta enfermedad empuja a las personas infectadas al margen de la sociedad. Y nuestra sociedad los clasificó como marginados. Un marginado pierde todos los privilegios, incluido el de vivir con la familia y la comunidad. Para proteger a las personas sanas, los leprosos tenían que gritar: "¡inmundo, inmundo!". Luego, tendrán que presentarse ante un sacerdote que declarará a las personas limpias o inmundas. (Levítico 13).Una vez declarado impuro, el leproso se convierte en un marginado.

El hombre en el evangelio de hoy acaba de ser declarado inmundo y se acercó a Jesús y arrodillándose le suplicó y le dijo: "si quieres, puedes limpiarme". Movido a compasión, Jesús extendió la mano, lo tocó y le dijo: "Yo

quiero. Quedas limpio".

La lepra y el pecado se reflejan mutuamente en muchos aspectos. En efecto, el pecador es un marginado, se aleja de la comunidad. Se le considera marginado. Al igual que el leproso, él es una carga para sí mismo. El pecado hace que la vida sea una carga para uno mismo y para los demás. Todo pecado afecta a la sociedad, ya sea un pecado oculto, siempre daña y afecta a la comunidad. Por eso no existe el pecado privado, todo pecado es de naturaleza social.

Sin embargo, incluso si la lepra es externa y el pecado es interno, ambos tienen consecuencias similares en la persona. Hace que la persona sea impura. Tanto la primera lectura como el evangelio afirman y reconocen el importante papel del sacerdote al declarar a la persona limpia e inmunda.

¿Cuál es la implicación de esto para el pecado? ¡Jesús no quiere perdonarnos sin sus sacerdotes y su Iglesia! Jesús seguirá limpiándonos a través de sus sacerdotes especialmente en el sacramento de la confesión. Y así San Pablo nos insta en la segunda lectura a ser imitadores de Cristo que continúen su ministerio de curar y perdonar. Que seamos como él en nuestro trato con los marginados de nuestra sociedad y demos gloria a Dios.

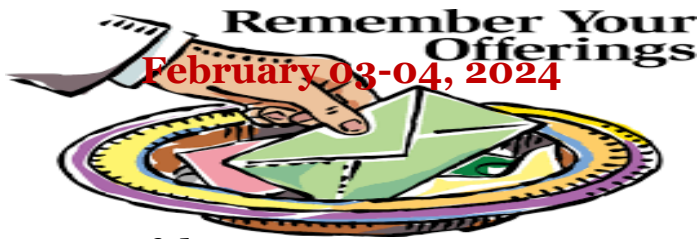
